HEADS UPDATE

I am getting to know the schools around the area much better now and building up relationships with our cluster schools and beyond. I have met a few times now with the Heads from Amesbury Primary and Amesbury Archer and set up links through sport. Some of our teachers also link up with the teachers from these schools to discuss specific areas of the curriculum and compare standards with pupils outside their school. Collaborative working is a great way of sharing expertise, resources and support.

Another school we are building up strong relationships with is St Osmund's Primary in Salisbury. They are our closest Catholic primary school and so we share a common interest and status. During the Spring Term, Mrs Clarke took over as the Special Needs Coordinator and whilst she is an excellent Resource Base Manager, we still wanted to provide support for her in the SEN processes and procedures that need to be followed. To do this we employed the Special Needs Coordinator from St Osmund's for a day a week and this made the transition for Mrs Clarke much smoother. Drawing on expertise from other professionals working in another school like this can sometimes be better than bringing in experts who dip into lots of schools, as they live and breathe it everyday.

Miss Sterck has been the leader for Teaching Learning and Assessment (TLA) at St Osmund's for the last five years and has considerable experience and success in this area. Between the Head at St Osmunds and myself, we have negotiated Miss Sterck supporting Mrs Hamblin in her role this term every Friday. Together they will ensure that all TLA systems are robust and working incredibly efficiently. They will monitor the pupils work very closely to ensure they are being challenged according to high expectations and they will work with me on making sure we have the right strategies in place to take us out of special measures next year.

Lots of positive steps are being taken at the moment and I look forward to updating you in future newsletters.
