HEAD'S UPDATE

If last week was busy, then this week has been even more intense. We have made great strides on implementing what I believe to be a sustainable staff structure and can I just tell you that the staff have been incredibly supportive. I have had numerous discussions around job roles and responsibilities that give staff an opportunity to have a greater impact on your child's experiences in school. We are trying to create a culture of leadership around the school where people take ownership of things that will make our school even better.

We have even got the children on board:

- ◆ Year 5 started a Young Leaders programme this week that will see them take charge of activities for younger children at playtimes. I will be investing in more equipment that allows them to have zones in the playground offering a variety of activities.
- ◆ Our Year 6 House Captains have set up a committee and are currently recruiting Year 4 and 5 children as assistants. They are devising a programme of inter-house competitions that will start after half term. Their enthusiasm is infectious and should be encouraged—they have approached me for a meeting room and also Mrs Botwright for some resources. We were happy to support their request.

OFSTED

In last week's newsletter, I said that I would share my School Development planning with you. My first step on this is to create a culture of leadership at the School.

Two of the Ofsted issues from February, also highlighted in our HMI visit last week, was the lack of focus and investment in leadership. I will share the changes taking place in senior leadership, but for this newsletter I would like to let you know how I am building leadership capacity across the whole school.

Leadership is not just a title, it is an attitude. Anyone can be a leader no matter how small the project or how small the team. The first step is to take ownership of something and make it your own.

This week I have been speaking to staff and talking about how they can do this and have a direct impact on whole school improvement. Last year this was carried out using a top down approach. My approach is to grow from the bottom up giving people greater purpose and motivation through clearly defined roles and responsibilities. I have currently fitted 9/10 of the jigsaw pieces into place. Next week I will share the full structure with you.
