HEADS UPDATE

The valuable role that teaching assistants (TAs) play in schools has evolved over the years. The days of supporting teachers with displays, photocopying and hearing readers has now transformed into a much more efficient and focused use of time with the children. The new methods and approaches used in school are now more about **supporting the child** than *supporting the teacher!* All adults in school should be focusing all their effort on roles that directly provide the best educational experience for children.

Based on all of this, we are enhancing the way our TAs work from September. They will be more targeted and focused on specific children and groups of children. Our analysis of tests and evaluation of pupil's work provides us with information on every child. This means we know when children fall behind or have certain gaps in their knowledge. We also know which children are coasting and could do better and also those that need that extra push to really excel. These factors influence a detailed plan of programmes to support children, led by our leaders in school and delivered by teachers and TAs.

From September, each Key Stage will have a TA focused on delivering interventions and catch-up programmes across the classes. Teachers will identify children in their class that need this support and the TAs will implement a rapid and accelerated programme of activities to help them catch up. Teachers will also choose other groups that need support in other ways like delivering programmes that stretch the more able children.

Our new structure for September will also see a TA in KS1 and in KS2 trained as a Higher Level Teaching Assistant (HLTA) with the ability to lead class lessons when teachers are absent. This previously has been done by TAs.

Emotional support will double next year with extra resource being put in place. We consider it a top priority that our emotionally and socially vulnerable children are cared for, listened to and supported in school. Ms Rossall will also remain as a full time TA in Reception Class to support our newest and youngest children.

We are sad to announce that Miss Taylor will not be returning to CTK this term. Over her 16 years here, she has seen the school through a mix of great and difficult times and built up strong relationships along the way with staff, parents and the children. She has asked that the following words be published to parents:

"I am writing to inform you that I have decided to step down as deputy head teacher after 16 years here at Christ The King. I have thoroughly enjoyed my time working with the dedicated staff, parents, wonderful pupils and the whole school community who all come together to make this school a special place. I wish you all every success in the future. I intend to pursue new leadership opportunities in education but will always have a place in my heart for this school." **S. Taylor**
